In winter the bar also boasts a real log fire in the inglenook fireplace.*

<p><b>02. Pinot Grigio Pavia Tipica 2005 (HOUSE)</b>  <b>Italy</b>  <i>A light straw colour with a characteristic fragrance and a light, distinct hint of acacia blossoms. Dry, creamy, delicate and harmonious.</i></p>	£3.60	£14.25
<p><b>03. Galope Sauvignon Blanc 2006 Indomita Winery</b>  <b>Maule Valley, Chile</b>  <i>Feels fresh on the palate and packed with exotic fruit aromas. Well balanced acidity.</i></p>	£3.70	£14.75

<p><b>06. Flamingo Bay Chenin Blanc 2005 Darling Cellars</b>  <b>Coastal, West South Africa</b>  <i>Dry white wine with ripe tropical flavours of pineapple, guava and melon. A crisp, balancing acidity.</i></p>		£13.75
<p><b>07. Muscadet Sèvre et Maine Sur Lie 2005</b>  <b>Domaine de la Cognardière</b>  <b>Loire Valley, France</b>  <i>Traditionally bone dry and fruity with well balanced acidity. More complex than most Muscadet. Produced by a small family run estate.</i></p>		£16.25

Petit Chablis 2004 Château de Maligny, Jean Paul Durup</b>  <b>Burgundy, France</b>  <i>The Petit Chablis is a wine that is fresh and pleasant with a very present minerality and flavours of flowers. It has a good attack together with a long persistency in the mouth. The vineyard is only a few yards away from 1er Cru Chablis so expect very high quality.</i></p>		£23.50
<p><b>09. Sancerre Clos du Bouffants 2004 Domaine du Colombier</b>  <b>Loire Valley, France</b>  <i>A wine of great typicity and uniqueness. Very rich, aromatic bouquet and round in the mouth.</i></p>		£24.50

<p><b>11. Merlot del Veneto Collezione 2005 (HOUSE)</b>  <b>Italy</b>  <i>This Merlot shows approachable plummy fruit on the palate alongside youthful acidity creating a fruity, fresh, lighter styled wine.</i></p>	£3.45	£13.50
<p><b>12. Highcliff Shiraz 2004</b>  <b>Murray River, Australia</b>  <i>Good concentration of flavour. Deep, dark and smooth with blackcurrant and blackberry fruit.</i></p>	£3.70	£14.75
<p><b>13. Rioja Crianza 2003 Bodegas Heredad Ugarte</b>  <b>Spain</b>  <i>Mature fruit dominate in an incipient bouquet, which captures the ageing and a slightly toasty aroma. Soft tannins make it more palatable with an excellent aromatic aftertaste.</i></p>	£4.45	£17.50
<p><b>14. Leo la Gaffelière 2002</b>  <b>St Emilion, Bordeaux</b>  <i>Medium bodied with plum and blackcurrant flavours alongside the cedar like finish of good St Emilion.</i></p>	£5.50	£22.00
<p><b>15. St Auriol Cabernet 2003 St Auriol Winery</b>  <b>Vin de Pays d'Oc, France</b>  <i>Ruby colour with sparkling highlights. Spicy nose with a dash of bell pepper. In the mouth, the wine has good length and is thoroughly elegant with subtle tannins.</i></p>		£15.25
<p><b>16. Chianti Riserva "la Rosa" 2002</b>  <b>Italy</b>  <i>A harmonious, dry, sapid and lightly tannic flavoured wine, fining with time to become soft and elegant.</i></p>		£18.75
<p><b>17. Fleurie 2003 Domaine de la Bouronière</b>  <b>Beaujolais, France</b>  <i>Floral bouquet with ripe plummy flavours making this a very delicate and pleasant wine to drink, Fleurie is always the more feminine of all Cru Beaujolais.</i></p>		£25.00
<p><b>18. Rioja Reserva 1998 Bodegas Heredad Ugarte</b>  <b>Spain</b>  <i>Broad range of aromas with especially excellent integration of the barrel ageing. A very expressive fruity character and a particularly well balanced wine with mature, powerful tannins..</i></p>		£26.75
<p><b>19. Châteauneuf du Pape "le Devers" 2003 Vincent Maurel</b>  <b>Rhône Valley, France</b>  <i>"Le Devers" is a traditional wine and a classic. The emphasis is placed on the softer tannins and the more prominent aromas. This wine is characterised by its elegance, balance and freshness, which most people will find accessible. Vincent Maurel is also very highly rated by Robert Parker.</i></p>		£30.50
